NORTH BERGEN MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY



The North Bergen Municipal Utilities Authority takes pride in the dedication and involvement of its employees on their commitment to earn and receive the Water Environment Federation's "George W. Burke Jr" Award.

The NBMUA maintains a very active safety program with the objective of improving workplace safety for its 80 employees, and to raise employee awareness in order to reduce accidents. This is accomplished through monthly site specific safety training and regular review and updating of our safety programs. In addition, administration staff participate in quarterly safety meetings along with our safety professionals and safety consultants to review and discuss any safety related issues which may include accidents, upcoming training, loss control topics, or address safety equipment needs.

As a result of all our efforts, the NBMUA has not had any serious accidents or received any safety violations in several years and has been recognized by the New Jersey Utility Joint Insurance Fund since 2005 for achieving a perfect score in our Safety Incentive Program.

BRUCE SMITH

Bruce has been involved in the wastewater industry since 1971. He has been an active member of the New Jersey Water Environment Association and the Water Environment Federation.

Bruce began his career with the Hackettstown MUA. He held various Operations positions with the Authority

including Sewer Utility Superintendent and was appointed to the position of Utilities Superintendent in charge of both Water and Sewer Utility operations in 1980. He left the Hackettstown MUA in 1983 to accept a position with Exxon Research & Engineering to operate their Industrial Wastewater Treatment Facility. He returned to the Hackettstown MUA as Deputy Director in 1987 and was the Authorities' Executive Director from 1989 until his retirement at the end of 2015. Since retirement, Bruce has consulted for several utilities.

Bruce believes that much of his success is due to his involvement with the North Section and the New Jersey Water Environment Association. He is a past North Section President and has been a member of numerous Section and NJWEA committees. More recently, Bruce has been the NJWEA Treasurer and assumed the position of NJWEA Comptroller in February 2017.



NJDEP. He was former President of the North Jersey Section NJWEA 2006-2008.

Brian received a BA in Environmental Studies from Ramapo College in 2007, attending weekends and nights over a period of ten years.

In 1979, Brian was inducted in the North Jersey Section Selected Society of the Outhouse. Other awards received over the years include the T. William Cleveland Outstanding Service; The North Jersey Section Service Award; the NJWEA Safety Award; The WEF Burke Safety Award and the USEPA O&M Excellence Award and is a member of the Quarter Century Operators Club, the Society of Sanitary Sludge Shovelers and the Golden Manhole Society.

at the Linden Roselle Sewerage Authority where she not only learned all of the laboratory's certified analyses, but also furthered her knowledge of the wastewater treatment process by taking the Advanced Wastewater Treatment course with Hudson County School of Technology and the Microbiology of Activated Sludge course with Rutgers University. She enjoyed her time as a Laboratory Technician training new hires, troubleshooting laboratory equipment and learning all QA/QC regulations and requirements. LOUIS LAMBE

Lou is an NJIT graduate and a Civil Engineer at the Passaic Valley Sewerage Commission (PVSC) where he has been employed since September of 1988 and has been responsible for the municipal allocation of metered flows since 1992. In 2003, he helped develop PVSC's Municipal Rebate Incentive Program for Connection Fees which was recognized by the USEPA with a 1st Place Clean Water Act Recognition Award in 2003, the AEA Wave Award in 2005 and the NACWA "Forward Thinking" award in 2010.



From 2011 to 2016 Lou served as the Superintendent of Line Operations and licensed C-4 operator of record for PVSC. Since 2016, Lou has been developing PVSC's legacy Geographic Information System which was recognized in 2020 by the AEA for "Best Management Practices."

In 2008, Lou joined the NJWEA's Collection System Committee and has served as its Chair since 2012. He also serves on the NJWEA's Tech Transfer, Annual Conference, GIS & Asset Management, and IT Committees. Lou represented the NJWEA as a WEF Delegate from 2022 to 2024 serving on multiple national committees. As a member of the WEF National Collection System Committee, Lou helped co-author WEF's 2014 "Collection Systems Operators' Guide to Preparing for the Certification Examination." As a state certified instructor of the Advanced Collection Systems Course, Lou teaches at the Hudson County School of Technology and teaches the annual recertification course for the NJWEA.

Lou served the Township of Cranford as a Commissioner to the Rahway Valley Sewerage Authority from 2016-2021 and as Chairman for 2019. Lou also volunteers with the Lions Club as a Treasurer, IT Chair, Environmental Chair, and District Administrator as well as a trustee and Treasurer for the Lions Eye Research Foundation of NJ.

Lou is a past recipient of the Joseph Bonaccorso Operator Educator Award and WEF Quarter Century Operator Award in 2020, the 5S Golden Shovel and the Harry P. Croft Service Awards in 2016, the Isaac Welcome Collection System Award in 2014 and his Golden Manhole in 2013.

Lou and his family currently reside in Middletown where he and his wife Beth will happily retire together in June 2025.

MARCAL MANUFACTURING LLC

1 MARKET STREET ELMWOOD PARK, NJ

Marcal Manufacturing, LLC, located in Elmwood Park, NJ, produces household paper products, such as paper towels, napkins, and facial tissue, made from recycled waste paper. The waste paper is purchased from various sources, mixed with detergent and water, heated to 110 degrees F, and dissolved into a pulp. The pulp is processed in a series of screens before going to the paper machines. The paper machines drain the water from the cellulose pulp fibers and heated rollers press and dry what becomes a continuous sheet of paper. The dried paper is wound up into a large roll and further converted into smaller rolls. The wastewater is processed by primary clarification with dissolved air flotation (DAF), biological treatment (aerated reservoir), final clarification, and solids dewatering (belt and screen presses). The final effluent is pH-adjusted and discharged to the PVSC sewer system. Marcal discharges an average of 1,044,000 gpd to the PVSC POTW.

HILLSIDE BEVERAGE PACKING, LLC

1 EVANS TERMINAL ROAD HILLSIDE, NJ 07205

Hillside Beverage Packing, LLC (HBP) is a boutique bottling facility with the capability of producing carbonated beverages in glass, PET, and aluminum bottles since 2009. HBP produces bottled and carbonated beverages in quantities that don't meet the production requirements of large contract packing facilities. Process wastewater is collected and pumped to neutralization tanks. The pH setpoints are 6.2 SU and 8.8 SU. When the pH is within the set point range, the wastewater is recycled through the discharge pH probe for approximately 15 seconds before automatic discharge to the sanitary sewer. If the wastewater is out of the specified pH range, the discharge pump will shut down preventing wastewater discharge out of the allowable pH range. The allowable pH discharge range is 6.0 SU to 9.0 SU. The facility discharges an average of 11,700 gpd of wastewater to the Joint Meeting of Essex and Union Counties (JMEUC) POTW. All reports, including monthly reports, are submitted ahead of the required submittal date. HBP cooperates fully with the POTW to maintain compliance with all Industrial User Permit Requirements.


ALAN J. KENNEDY

HARRY P. CROFT

After Serving as Program Chair for six years, at the annual Conference in 2008 I received the Harry P. Croft award for "distinguished and outstanding service to the NJWEA". At the time I asked who was Harry P. Croft and why did the NJWEA name an award after him? From the Awards booklet that was distributed at the Presidents Luncheon I learned that the NJWEA has been giving out the Croft Award since 1970 and that I was the 46th person to receive the award. The fact that so few people had been given this award and the introduction provided by then President Joe Bonaccorso made me feel quite appreciated by the NJWEA, hard work (without pay) was rewarded. But the question remained who was Harry P. Croft and why is an award named after him? I learned from some

Executive Committee members that Harry Croft was a charter member of the Association. He was also the Chief Engineer of the New Jersey State Department of Health (predecessor of the NJDEP) from 1918 to 1951 But nothing was written down. I found the same was true for a great number of the people who have been honored by the NJWEA with an award or scholarship named after them. So as we approached our 100th Anniversary, and before the old guard at the NJWEA forgets, I felt it would be a good idea to have a brief biography of the folks who have been honored by the NJWEA with an Award or Scholarship in their name. What I was able to put together follows.

Awards - The Harry P Croft Award (Since 1970)

Probably as much as any man, Harry P. Croft contributed greatly to the organization he helped found, the New Jersey Sewage Works Association, now the NJWEA. Past presidents of Association like Sol Seid and Mike Kachorsky remembered Croft as a leader and encourager of young men coming up in the sewage treatment field, instilling pride in their professionalism, pushing ahead with the ideal of water pollution control.

Croft worked for years in the State Department of Health as the Chief Sanitary Engineer in the Bureau of Engineering and Sanitation of the State Department of Health (1918 to 1950). Both Sol and Mike Kachorsky remember Croft as being "great for the operator. He made sure the operator was looked after, was not forgotten. He got after the young guys and made them get their licenses." Both acknowledge that it was a shove from Croft that got them to work for their licenses. Kachorsky remembered Croft for the progress made in the State in expanding sanitary sewerage systems during the depression years when New Deal programs like WPA and the Public Works Administration (PWA) made federal funds available for public works projects. Many treatment plants were built through Croft's hard work in bringing in to New Jersey the federal funds to get plants built in hard-pressed communities. "Croft insisted that the State Health Department should have close cooperation at all times with responsible persons at the local level – the superintendents, the operators and engineers", said Sol Seid.

Croft also is remembered as "working behind the scenes" to build up the Association. At the Thirty-third annual meeting of the organization held March 11, 1948 at the old Stacy Trent Hotel, Trenton, a crowd turned out to honor Harry Croft. The program containing a picture of Croft carried these words: "The New Jersey Sewage Works Association takes pleasure in dedicating its Thirty-third annual meeting as a testimonial to Harry P. Croft. He is a charter member of the Association and has an outstanding record of service. We congratulate him upon the 35th anniversary of his association with the New Jersey Department of Health and upon his 30th anniversary as Chief Engineer of that Department. We admire him for his professional accomplishments; we know that he has been responsible in a large measure for the advancement and success of the Association; we appreciate that he has been a friend of the sewage plant operators. The State of New Jersey and the New Jersey Sewage Works Association are indebted greatly to Harry P. Croft."

Croft was a Lehigh University graduate, his specialty in sanitary engineering, and his years with the State Health Department coincided with his activities with the Association. He was a charter member of the 1915 founded New Jersey pioneer organization. Croft died in 1950 but not before he had made a lasting contribution to the State, the Association and those he encouraged to lead and take pride in the industry's advancement

ROBERT C. FISCHER

After graduating High School Robert C. (Bob) Fischer became a driller working with the Drillers, Blasters and Miners Union on the 63rd street subway tunnel in New York City. Tired of the strikes, wet environment and not crazy about working underground all day, he applied for a job in the sewer.

Bob has been working in the Wastewater Field since 1981. He started his career at the Western Monmouth Utilities Authority (WMUA) in Englishtown, N.J. working as an operator. Richard Jenkins, Superintendent of the WMUA



at that time, pushed him to further his education and he went back to school to obtain his NJDEP S-1, 2 & 3 licenses and in 1993 became the Chief Operator of the North Bergen Municipal Utilities Authorities Woodcliff Treatment Plant (NBMUA). In 1995 he obtained his S-4 license, and in 1996 he graduated New Jersey Institute of Technology with a BS degree in Chemical Engineering. Soon afterwards he was promoted to Executive Director of the NBMUA. In 2003 his old boss Richard Jenkins, who was then the Superintendent of the Bayshore Regional Sewerage Authority (BRSA), invited him to interview for the Executive Director's position at BRSA. During his tenure there he oversaw many upgrades and improvements including a \$50 million dollar restoration of the BRSA treatment plant caused by Superstorm Sandy damage in 2012.

Bob has been involved in the North Section of the New Jersey Water Environment Association since starting his employment with North Bergen MUA. He has served as the Section's Secretary, Treasurer and President.

At the State level Bob has been a member of the Public Education Committee, a Judge of the Hudson County Science Fair at the Liberty Science Center and has been presenting the wastewater treatment process in elementary schools for 25 years. He has presented on various subjects at NJWEA & WEF events. Twenty years ago he started the NJWEA Middle School Essay Contest for eighth graders. Bob was the Chairman of the Seminar and Technology Transfer Committee for 12 years from 2000 to 2012. He served as the NJWEA President from 2012 to 2014, a Water Environment Federation Delegate for two terms and as State Treasurer. He has been a member of several other committees and is currently the Chairman of the NJWEA Long Range Planning Committee.

Upon his retirement from BRSA in 2020 Bob assumed a leadership role as a Senior Director in the Water Resources Department of the engineering firm PS&S. Bob has been providing technical and administrative guidance and assistance to sewerage authorities and municipalities covering a variety of issues including: process improvements, project management, regulatory compliance, FEMA assistance, licensed operator of record services and operator training.

Bob and his wife Susan have two children, Christiana and Nicholas. They live in Howell Township.



LEROY FORMAN

Born and raised in Trenton, Leroy Forman worked as a chemist at the New Jersey State Department of Health during the formative years of sewage treatment, regulation and standardization. By the 1920's he was a senior chemist in the Bureau of Engineering of the State Department of Health. Leroy Forman first presented at the New Jersey Sewage Works Association (NJSWA) at the thirteenth annual meeting (March 23, 1928) on BOD determination and procedural standardization. He presented at the

sixteenth annual meeting on March 20, 1931 on operational problems at sewage treatment plants in New Jersey.

During the 1930's through the 1950's, Leroy Forman presented technical sessions at the NJSWA, the Federation of Sewage Works Associations, the American Water Works Association, the American Public Health Association and other environmental organizations on topics including stream pollution regulation, analytical methodologies and standardization, taste and odor control, and controls for plant operations.

In working with treatment plant operators, Leroy Forman recognized that frequently plant operations had to be revised to cope with treatment problems and that the operator was the key to these revisions. The Leroy Forman Award was established in 1970 and has been presented yearly since then to a member of the NJWEA for the originality, significance, comprehensiveness, effort and most importantly, the verification of an idea by the application of in plant studies of operational processes.

Leroy Forman retired September 1, 1961 as the Principal Public Health Engineer in the Stream Pollution Control Program of the Division of Environmental Health of the State Department of Health after more than 40 years employed by the Department. Upon his retirement it was noted that, "Roy was active in sewage treatment plant investigational work and was the author of an operator's manual. Although the manual is now out of print it was recognized as an outstanding piece or work in the field.


Roy is well known to operators throughout the State and is considered.

Leroy Forman passed away on March 25, 1969, at the age of eighty-six.

THOMAS GRENCI

Tom Grenci has more than forty years of experience in the field of environmental science and management. Tom's work experience includes laboratory and laboratory management; environmental consulting in the fields of water, wastewater, sludge, soil and hazardous waste; and training in health & safety and environmental compliance. Tom is a founding partner of Environmental Compliance Monitoring, Inc. (ECM), a consulting, operations and testing firm established in 1987. Prior to his work at ECM, Tom worked for Princeton Aqua Science as a laboratory manager, IT Corporation as a laboratory manager and facilities manager and Chemical Waste Management as a technical



manager for their regional Site Remediation Division and Waste Approval Facility.

Tom has been a long-time active member of the New Jersey Water Environment Association (NJWEA). He is a Life Member of the Water Environment Federation (WEF) and the NJWEA. He has participated on many Association committees including the Program, Technology Transfer, Safety, Membership, Publications, Library & Archives, Scholarship, Executive, Nominating, Policy Advisory, 100th Year, Hazardous Waste/Site Remediation, Awards, Special Programs and the Long Range Planning committees. Tom has served as the chair of the Hazardous Waste Committee, Publications Committee, Long Range Planning Committee, Policy Advisory Committee, Library & Archives Committee (current). Tom co-chaired the 100 Year Commemorative Book Subcommittee where he was also Co-Editor. Tom is currently the Editor for the NJWEA association journal, NJ Effluents.

From 2005 to 2008 and 2018 to 2021, Tom was a Water Environment Federation (WEF) Director/Delegate representing the NJWEA. During his tenure as a delegate, Tom served on the House of Delegates' (HOD) Steering Committee where he chaired a workgroup on Communicating the Value of WEF and participated in several other HOD work groups and subcommittees. Tom also served on several WEF committees including the Safety Task Force, Laboratory Committee, Membership Committee and Long Range Planning Committee.

Tom has been honored by the NJWEA with several certificates of appreciation and awards for his support of the Association. NJWEA awards of particular honor include the Hazardous Waste Management Award (1995), Arthur Sidney Bedell Award (2016), the Young Professionals Committee, Young at Heart Award (2019) and the Central Section Thomas J. Crapper Award (2022). Tom is a proud member of the Order of the 55 Gallon Drum (1990), the Select Society of Sanitary Sludge Shovelers (1994) and an honorary member of the Golden Manhole Society (2015). Tom served as President of NJWEA from 2016 to 2018.

Tom Grenci is a graduate of Rutgers University (NCAS) with post graduate work at Rutgers University Busch campus and Montclair State University in environmental management.

Tom Grenci's remarkable career as a protector of New Jersey's water environment is unmatched. That, coupled with his dedication to sharing his knowledge and experience through the NJWEA causes his induction to the Hall of Fame to be applauded by all.
