Water and wastewater utilities today face a diverse array of risks. Some of the risk categories include climate change risks (flooding, seal level rise), aging infrastructure risks, social challenges, extreme manmade or natural events, impaired water resources (e.g. from nutrients), and power outages.

The NJWEA believes that several of the courses we offer will meet the respective Board's requirements for CPCC because of the review process and administrative controls we have that each proposed course must go through before being offered to Professional Engineers. These courses include "NJPE" and/or "NYPE" in the course description. However, all issues that may arise on the acceptability of a course will be between the individual and the Board. The Professional Engineer should retain the program book and his/her certificates received after the completion of the technical sessions issued by the NJWEA. The NJWEA will continue to maintain records of the courses offered and the names of attendees satisfactorily completing the courses.

Pennsylvania Professional Engineers - The

New Jersey Water Environment Association (NJWEA) currently offers continuing professional competency credits (CPCC) for Professional Engineers that are licensed in New Jersey and/or New York. We believe these and many of our other courses also meet the CPCC requirements of a Professional Engineer that is licensed in Pennsylvania. The Pennsylvania State Board of Professional Engineers, Land Surveyors and Geologists (the Board) do not approve courses in advance. However, certain technical sessions provided by the NJWEA should meet the Board's requirements for CPCC if the Professional Engineer retains the program book and his/her certificates received after the completion of the technical sessions issued by the NJWEA. However, all issues that may arise on the acceptability of a course will be between the individual and the Board. NJWEA will continue to maintain records of the courses

offered and the names of attendees satisfactorily completing the courses

NJWEA Registration Policy Changes - For close to 20 years, the NJWEA included the cost of membership in the non-member registration rates for its conference, courses and seminars. We felt, and still feel, that the overall benefit of NJWEA membership is a value-added advantage for many of us both professionally and socially. The benefit of membership is especially valuable for environmental professionals needing continuing education training credits. Many of our members with no continued education training requirements find value in NJWEA membership. For some, however, the added cost of WEF/NJWEA membership proves to be a cost burden.

With that said, the NJWEA is offering a third registration option. The new registration structure will include the two traditional rates; member rate and non-member or renewal membership rate (including the cost of WEF/NJWEA membership) options. The third option will be a *non-member/no-membership required* rate. That rate will be higher than the member rate, but much less than the WEF/NJWEA membership included rate.

You can choose the rate that best suits your needs; however, there are considerations outside of the cost savings alone that should be considered.

For more information regarding the considerations outside of the cost savings alone when determining which registration option to select, please contact any member of the NJWEA Executive Committee.

The choice will be yours to decide; however, in addition to the "simple math," you will have to include the intangible benefits to membership with the NJWEA.

NJWEA Membership Options – The NJWEA offers a new membership option:

* NJWEA Associate Membership. This lower cost membership option, \$55.00 per year, provides all of benefits of Association Membership in the NJWEA.

It does not provide WEF Benefits, particularly operators do not receive a TCH for each year of membership. To receive the contact hour, you must be a member of WEF. That choice is yours.
